



**TOWN COUNCIL
MEETING MINUTES
SEPTEMBER 29, 2020**

The Town Council met in special session on Tuesday, September 29, 2020 at 6:00 p.m. at 372 Town Place, Fairview, Texas. Those present were Mayor Henry Lessner; Councilmembers Cynthia Brugge, Ken Logsdon and Roland Feldman. Councilmembers Charlie Henkle and Tony Mattei attended via teleconference. Mayor Pro Tem Ricardo Doi was absent. Staff present included Town Manager, Julie Couch; Town Engineer, James Chancellor; and Town Secretary, Tenitrus Bethel. Staff present via teleconference included Town Engineer, Danielle Oglesbee.

Mayor Lessner called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. and declared a quorum was present and invited everyone to stand for the Pledge of Allegiance and the Texas State pledge.

CITIZENS INPUT:

Kim Seaber, 1200 Camino Real, expressed her thoughts related to the drainage discussion.

WORK SESSION – DRAINAGE STUDY: Mayor Lessner introduced agenda item 5, hold Council work session to discuss the Town drainage system including Town policies, procedures, processes, activities and related matters and take any necessary action.

Mr. Chancellor gave a presentation and discussed ground water, pervious and impervious surfaces, seeps and soil, and stream bank erosion.

The Council and staff had an extended discussion related to this topic.

Ms. Couch recommended to the Council to submit in any additional concerns related to drainage that have not been addressed. She stated at an upcoming meeting Huitt-Zollars will be presenting the second phase of the analysis related to detention. Mr. Chancellor stated the analysis will address if the Town should require detention and the benefits of regional detention.

The Council had an extended discussion related to the study and upcoming meeting dates.

Ms. Couch recommended October 13 at 6:00 p.m. as the date for the next drainage discussion including the representative from Huitt-Zollars. The Council agreed to the meeting date.

Mayor Lessner adjourned the meeting at 7:48 p.m.
